

After getting his PhD in marine ecology, Yves Henocque started his career in the field of aquaculture and sea ranching to the benefit of small-scale fishermen. He then acquired environmental management and international cooperation skills through technical training in the United States and professional practice in Japan, to start a new coastal environment laboratory in Toulon (IFREMER) where he developed integrated coastal management and strategic planning practices in collaboration with a number of Mediterranean organizations including PAP/RAC within the Mediterranean Action Plan. Since then, he has led several ICM projects in the Mediterranean, West Indian Ocean, and South-East Asia regions. He is now Senior Adviser for Maritime Policy and Ocean Governance at the French Research Institute for the Sustainable Development of the Sea (IFREMER), while working on Mediterranean issues and initiatives (Chair of CIESM Committee 6 on Coastal Ecosystem and Marine Policy) and with the Asia-Pacific region and more specifically Japan where he was based during the last 3 years.
