



Formed in social and environmental sciences, Françoise Breton works since 1982 on the analysis and management of coastal and marine systems, and their governance. Since 1994, she heads the INTERFASE research group at the Geography Department of the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB). Since 2002, she is a member of the ICZM Expert Group of the European Commission. In 2001, she became Deputy-manager and manager of the European Topic Center (ETC) of the European Environment Agency (EEA), still active in the ETC today as scientific director. Between 2010 and 2014, she coordinates the EU FP7 PEGASO project, on governance and sustainable development in the Mediterranean and the Black Sea, and participates in the FP7 MEDINA Project in the South Mediterranean. She is member of the United Nations Program for the Mediterranean (UNEP-MAP). In 2015, granted by the NILS fund, she develops research on marine mammals in the Arctic, at the Universities of Svalbard and Tromsø. Partner of the PATEO project, coordinated by the French Institute for Research and Développement (IRD), she works on the West African coast on socio-environmental risk at the face of Global Change (2013-2016). She is member of the Steering Committee of the Coastal Commission from the International Geographic Union (IGU-CCS). In July 2015 she has been awarded by the Narcís Monturiol medail for research and innovation by the Catalan Government.
